Do you have experience of migrating to the UK? Are you interested in learning research skills and having the opportunity to use them in an exciting project? If so this role may be for you.

Peer research is conducted by people who have lived experience of the topic that is being researched. In this case that means that you will have experience of migrating to the UK.

You'll be working on a project aiming to understand and improve how migrants settle into their new communities in Yorkshire and Humber. You will take part in a research training programme, and undertake research tasks in a supportive environment. Migration Yorkshire recognises the value of involving people with lived experience of the research topic in the design and implementation of research, therefore we are looking for someone with experience of migrating to the UK.

You'll be supporting the research work of Migration Yorkshire and its partners in the Refugee Integration Yorkshire & Humber project. Topics include social interaction between new migrants and local communities, isolation experienced by new migrants and an understanding of 'wellbeing' by different communities, and the housing pathways of refugees.
