- <u>Barnardos Haven Project</u> offers one-to-one sessions for unaccompanied children, family sessions, school-based programmes, and support group Who is it for: children up to age 18 residents of North Lincolnshire
- <u>CAMHS</u> is an NHS service that provides therapy and emotional support for people with mental health challenges. You can find one in every local authority Who is it for: children and young people, including unaccompanied children.
- <u>'HEARTS'</u> project by Children's Society which provides advocacy support and therapeutic support

Who is it for: young people aged 15-25 in Leeds.

- <u>Chilypep's Children's Wellbeing Practitioners (CWP)</u> offers several therapeutic and wellbeing services for young people based in South Yorkshire.
   Who is it for: children and young people in Sheffield and Barnsley area.
- Multi- agency Psychological Support for Looked After Children MAPS is a team of professionals who support the mental health.
   Who is it for: children and young people looked after by Sheffield City Council.
- Refugee Council 'My View' and 'My View Remote' also offers therapeutic support which
  includes up to 12 sessions and has capacity for up to three urgent interventions for those
  with more complex cases.
   Who is it for: children between 12 and 17 years who are in Yorkshire and Humber and

- Refugee Council 'Children and Families Wellbeing Support' provides free specialist child and family therapy service for children, families, and schools.

   Who is it for: children and young children mainly 15-18 based in Bradford.
- <u>The Snowdrop Project</u> provides support to survivors of modern slavery and exploitation, including casework, counselling and community activities.

Who is it for: Anyone over 16 years old living in South Yorkshire with experience of exploitation, trafficking or modern slavery.
